

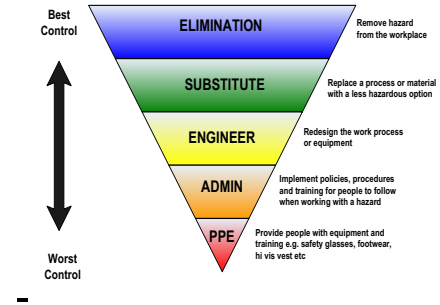

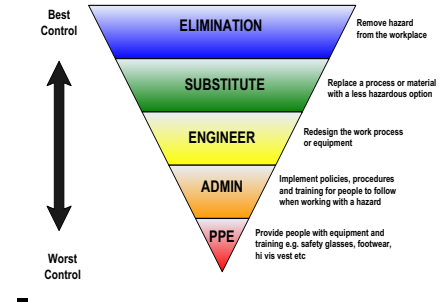

<i>Commence presentation</i>	X	Security issues, animal escape, bites, scratches to public, zoonotic disease transfer, slip and trip hazards whilst presenting, environmental exposure (sun, wind, rain etc.)	M (6)	Ensure that presentation barriers are affixed securely, animal boxes are to remain closed and locked at all times, all boxes to be connected together and attached to trolley, animal heads are to be kept away from public when interacting with animals to eliminate the possibility of bites, do not allow animals with claws to be held by public unless they are utilising long sleeve shirts, PPE to be utilised by presenter at all times (long pants, long sleeved shirt, enclosed shoes, gloves) where required, correct weather protection and PPE to be utilised to suit the conditions (hat, sun screen, jumper etc.), provide public with a wash point (alcohol gel) and encourage the use of correct hand washing and sanitisation techniques if contact is made with presentation animals	L (2)
